
Who We Are: New Jersey American Water

West 17th Street Improvements Project

Why are we investing \$3M in this system?

- The existing water & sewer infrastructure installed in the 1950's is at the end of its useful life.
 - > Sanitary Lift Station
 - > 2,000 LF of gravity sewer collection mains
 - > 2,000 LF of water distribution mains & appurtenances
- Current location poses access issues for nearby residents & NJAW maintenance crews
- Critical electrical & controls equipment is subject to flooding





West 17th Street Improvements Project



NJAW Proposed Upgrades

- New Sanitary Lift Station located in traffic median
 - Accessibility for maintenance
 - Accessibility for residents
 - Designed to have all critical components out of the 100-year flood elevation
 - Addition of Odor Control Equipment
- 2,000 LF of 8" PVC gravity collection mains
 - 14 new manholes
 - Renewed service laterals to the property lines
- 650 LF of 6" PVC sanitary forcemain
- 2,000 LF of 8" PVC water distribution mains
 - Renewed service lines to property lines




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Projected Construction Schedule

- New Sanitary Lift Station construction Spring
 2022
- 2,000 LF of 8" PVC gravity collection mains construction to follow the completion of the lift station (Fall 2022)
- 650 LF of 6" PVC sanitary forcemain constructed with the lift station (Spring 2022)
- 2,000 LF of 8" PVC water distribution mains construction to follow the completion of the sanitary sewer scope of work (Fall/Winter 2022)
- Final road restorations will be coordinated with the City of Ocean City

*Dates are subject to change based upon schedule of successful bidder & material availability. All work will be coordinated with the City of Ocean City's Stormwater Management Project
